 - (2) This is the amount for four years of tuition and fees for a full-time student enrolled fall and spring terms for four years based on the 2016/2017 rate of \$19,600 with a 3% annual increase; DOES NOT take into account grant and scholarship financial assistance.
 - (3) This is the amount for four years of (a) books and supplies of \$2,500 per year and (b) room and board of \$9,100 per year.
 - (4) This rate is computed on the graduates during the five years of 2011/2012 to 2015/2016 who either (a) obtained jobs or (b) enrolled in graduate school within one year of graduation.
