Requirements:

- 1. Must have a minimum of a master's degree and a minimum of 18 graduate hours in the course you wish to teach.
- 2. Must have excellent organizational, communication, teaching and decision-making skills.
- 3. Prior college teaching experience is strongly preferred.
- 4. Experience using the Canvas learning platform is preferred.
