

Position: Campus Minister of Discipleship
Department: Student Affairs – Health and Wellness

The University of Pikeville (UPIKE) is seeking applicants for the position of Campus Minister of Discipleship (CMD).

The mission of this role is to create and cultivate a culture of discipleship that enables students to engage in their faith, experience God, and extend service to others in the name of Jesus Christ during their time at UPIKE.

The CMD will serve as an integral part of the leadership team Campus Ministries, along with the University Chaplain and the Spiritual Life Committee at UPIKE. This role will have ownership of student discipleship and formation, worship development, preaching and teaching, and serve as part of the spiritual life committee. This role will collaborate in pastoral care with the chaplain.

This position is an opportunity to engage with students at a variety of levels. The University of Pikeville strives to serve students - 35% of whom are first-generation, 99% of whom receive some form of financial aid, and 18% of whom are non-white at the undergraduate level - by making learning accessible and affordable. One of the University's signature initiatives is Open Educational Resources, which offers no-cost course materials and reduces the economic burden on students and families. The University has a robust mentorship program and multiple other support programs to help new staff connect and succeed.

Responsibilities:

Student Discipleship and Formation

- Advising Leadership of Christian Spiritual Small Groups:
- Collaborate with the BCM, BUG, CDA, CMA, and FCA in their teaching vision
- Develop and coach community small leaders in group facilitation, student discipleship, studying scripture, practicing the ways of Jesus, and more.
- Oversee and support the logistics of weekly worship
- Collaborate with campus spiritual life committee
- Oversee discipleship strategies and programming for the campus

Preaching and Teaching

- Prepare and deliver chapel messages as needed
- Collaborate with the chaplain on long-term development.

Pastoral Care

- Partner with the chaplain to provide pastoral care to the UPIKE community as needed.
- Other duties assigned.

Required Skills:

- Prior experience in ministry work with young adults in a church or college campus setting.
- Experience working with, and demonstrated knowledge of, Christian spiritual formation principles and practices.
- Ability to work efficiently and effectively; sometimes carrying multiple projects simultaneously.
- Ability to lead a team of student workers toward shared goals, develop skills, keep team members accountable, maintain unity, and resolve conflict.
- Strong interpersonal skills with the ability to represent the mission of the University of Pikeville
- Ability to maintain calm and bring peace in stressful situations.
- Strong verbal and written communication skills.
- Ability to self-start, to keep information confidential, and to work well in a team environment.

Relationships:

The position requires daily contact with co-workers, supervisors, students, and external company personnel to discuss collaborative efforts, give support, offer direction, and generally share information. These relationships are maintained through email, telephone, text, and person-to-person contact.

• Masters in Divinity or ministry degree program.

Doctor of Ministry or PhD in practical theology
